Local technology innovation impresses at the AIIA's 2021 Digital Canberra iAwards

Australia's peak industry representative body for innovation technology, the Australian Information Industry Association (AIIA) is proud to announce the winners of the 2021 Digital Canberra iAwards. Sponsored by the ACT Government, the awards unearth, recognise and reward excellence in Australian innovation.

The iAwards are Australia's longest running and most broadly scoped innovation recognition program, promoting excellence in the Australian digital technology ecosystem.

The 28th annual ceremony recognising the entrants from the ACT took place on 21 July at its second ever fully virtual award ceremony. The entry process for the 2021 Digital Canberra iAwards followed last year's widely popular mechanic, with entrants submitting a three-minute pitch along with their submission, for what was called "The BIGGEST Pitch". The entrants demonstrated the incredible ways that businesses, government departments, startups and not-for-profit organisations continue to change and embrace innovative digital technologies.

Government & Public Sector Solution of the Year - Innovation: HAP-EE - Winner:

This program, called HAP-EE (Hearing Assessment Program Early Ears) conducts diagnostic hearing assessments, education, and training with a focus in regional and remote communities where access to hearing services are minimal. Our solution is different in that we have empowered the users to develop solutions that are not for purpose yet remain compatible with enterprise IT.

MindTheGap is an online healthcare directory built on this premise. With a single, free search, it lets anyone find all of the healthcare practitioners around them and then compare them by the cost of their basic services to quickly and easily and the practitioner who best meets their affordability criteria.

HUSKI AI is grounded in a knowledge machine that consists of 12 intelligent engines that orchestrate together to optimise its support for diverse and complex discoveries and evolution with an easy to use interface for optimized user experiences, which hides its underlying complexity.

Business & Industry Solutions of the Year - Innovation: Flexegraph - Winner:

Flexegraph

Flexegraph is an advanced liquid coolant that has superior thermal properties over traditional coolants. Whether in your car, a power station or Data Center, these older coolants are all essentially the same and use a water / glycol mix based on technology that is over 100 years old. At Flexegraph we take a new approach, using a suspension of Graphene that carries heat 10,000 times better than water. This means more efficient removal of heat from electrical systems, better performance, and a reduction of otherwise wasted energy.

Technology Platform Solution of the Year - Innovation: Trellis Intelligence Platform -

Winner: Trellis Data

Trellis Intelligence Platform is being trialled by the Federal Government to deliver 100% surveillance across the nation's container ports, to stop invasive pests from breaching biosecurity's processes, and the destruction of our precious food basins. The technology allows pests to be detected on the outside of every container that is transported from ship to shore in Australia.
